

JACK LONDON VILLAGE GLEN ELLEN, CALIFORNIA

Nestled in the heart of the Sonoma Wine Country town of Glen Ellen, on 2.5 stunning acres, The Wolf House Inn is an upscale boutique hotel, overlooking the Sonoma Creek and the oak studded Sonoma Valley Regional Park and is a stone's throw away from the existing historic Jack London Village retail complex.

The energy efficient, sustainable design of architect John Pflueger, is based on the craftsman/lodge architecture of Jack London's original "Wolf House", whose ruins remain in nearby Jack London State Historic Park. The condominium hotel has already been approved by various county commissions and reviewed by planning commission.





In this picturesque setting, the Inn can accommodate a maximum of 46 luxury suites, averaging 560 square feet; a grand lodge room that opens out to a large land-scaped plaza; as well as a spa and meeting rooms on the lower level next to the creek.

The grand lodge room houses a wine bar and catering kitchen that will provide buffet breakfasts and accommodate room service; which will be provided by the three full service restaurants in the adjacent Jack London Village complex.

Jack London Village can be reached by a short walk along a new creek side walkway one level below the parking lot. Guests can enjoy fine dining restaurants, and gourmet shops selling wine, olives, cheeses and chocolates, and discover the rich history: of General Vallejo's saw mill, Chauvet's grist mill, brandy distillery and winery, as well as the two railroad lines that were located just across the creek.
